Why did you choose to study your professional qualification?

Finance can seem very overwhelming to start with, lean on the people around you for help as we've all been in the same position and would much rather help than see you struggle!



What does a working day look like for you?

It's hard to say exactly as each day is different. I maintain a portfolio of clients that can come to me at different times with requests, sometimes all at once, which can be a challenge! Normally I will catch up with my team on a daily basis, I'll review my emails received overnight and look at what needs prioritising. From there I'll make a start on clearing tasks and queries as and when they come in.

Why did you choose Sanne?

When I left KPMG, I knew that I wanted to find a job suited to me. I took the time to look at employers, not just the role itself.
